End of Spring Season of Street Music



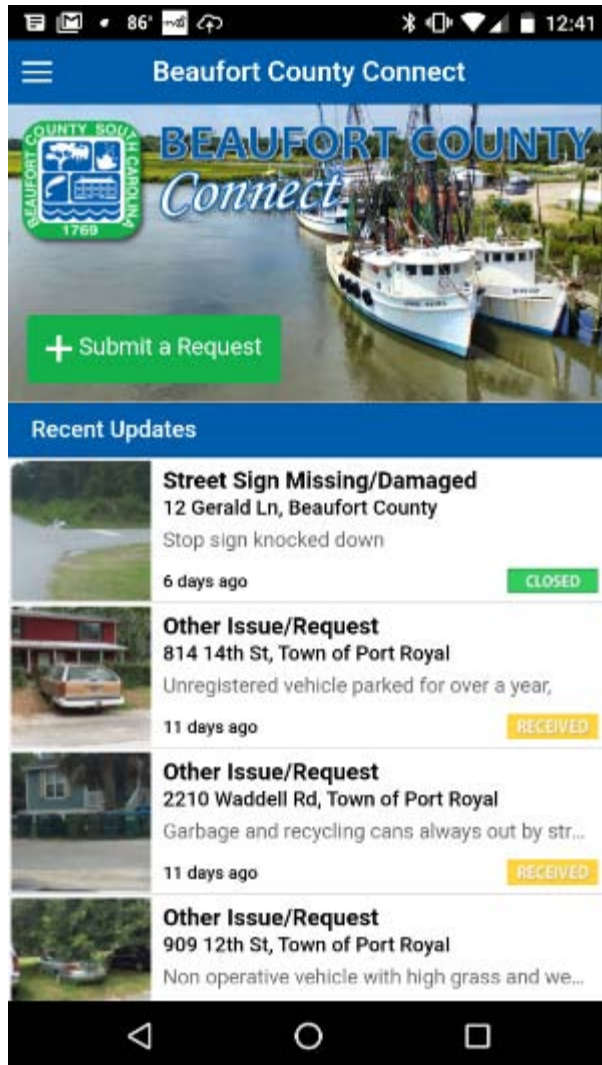

New Way to Report Code Violations or Maintenance Issues



For the past few weeks, the Town has been trialing a new way for residents to report code violations or items that need maintenance within the Town of Port

Royal. As part of the Beaufort County Connect App, you can now submit your issues or requests via the app and we will be alert to the request.

The status of the request or issue is updated and can be tracked via the App. As a matter of fact, you can see all outstanding issues and their status that have been reported in the Town within the App.

The App is available for both iPhones or Android and can be downloaded in their respective "stores". Just search for "Beaufort County Connect" and then download/install on your device.

When setting up the App for the first time, you will need to create an account in order to use the App. You do have the ability to report items anonymously if you so wish. Also, in order for the request to be worked on as expeditiously as possible, please allow the app to use your location when reporting and to also supply a photo.
